- Q 1. Which 2 rivers meet in York?
  - Ouse and the Fosse
- Q 2. Grimsby Town Football Club home ground is not in Grimsby. Where is it?
  - Cleethorpes
- Q 3. Which item of road safety was invented & produced in Halifax & who was the inventor?
  - Cat's eyes and Percy Shaw
- Q 4. Which of the 3 Bronte sisters is associated with Scarborough?
  - Anne, the youngest, set her novel 'Agnes Grey' in the town and is buried there.
- Q 5. Which are the MAIN Rivers that flow through these towns?
  - Sheffield (Don, can also accept the Sheaf)
  - Manchester (Irwell)
  - Lancaster (Lune)
  - Hull, but not the Humber (river Hull)
- Q 6. Where did the Bronte sisters live before Haworth
  - Thornton, a village to the north of Braford
