Dodgy email alert

Several members have received suspicious looking emails that appear to be from folk they know both within u3a and elsewhere. The first email might look innocent, just asking a question or requesting you make contact. The follow up lulls you into a false sense of security because you think you are helping someone who you know.

Examples we have had reported ask you to buy Amazon Gift Vouchers on behalf of your "friend" with what looks to be a genuine excuse for them not making their own purchase.

So ask yourself, does this feel right? Have they used your name in the text of the email? Are there grammar, punctuation and spelling mistakes? Phone your genuine contact and check. Look carefully at the email address that is being used to contact you. It may look genuine but it probably differs by just a letter or two.

If in doubt, chuck it out! Mark it as spam and delete. It is also good practice to change your email password regularly in case your own email program becomes compromised.
